Report on French Civic Service Volunteers at Othona Community, Essex

We have had the privilege of hosting two young French volunteers at the Othona Community for the last six months. They came to us via the French Service Civique (Civic Service), which involves both the voluntary and civic commitment of young people from 16 to 25 years old, which is usually undertaken in France but can also be done overseas.

The volunteers were recruited following the work of Molly O'Doherty and Nuno Doria from VAP to complete the necessary paperwork and recruited via the French organisation, Solidarités Jeunesses.

Floriane or Flo came from Southeastern France and was looking to spend time here primarily to improve her English but also to learn other new skills, whilst considering what to do next. It was lovely to have Flo join the team, she arrived in time to help out during our busy summer period when we have a lot of international guests and volunteers.

Flo was a great help in many aspects of the work at Othona from cleaning, housekeeping, painting, helping with guests, but her greatest contribution was in kitchen where her French culinary skills were very much appreciated. She enjoyed the chance to work with a wide range of other volunteers of different nationalities and interact with guests of all ages, abilities and backgrounds. Sadly Flo left in January this year but by then her English was much improved and she is now in New Zealand working as an Au Pair.

Paul Guerin started with us in October last year and is with us until the 13th March. Paul is from St. Malo and is in a gap year in his studies in accountancy and business. He has also been a great asset here, he is a very willing and positive volunteer and has been particularly helpful with outdoor work helping to dig out foundations, cut wood, gardening and construct a labyrinth. He is also very good at helping with cleaning, interacting with guests and just being a key member of the core team, we will miss him when he goes. He had the opportunity to join one of the VAP workcamps in December last year based in the South London parks, which he enjoyed. The chance to improve his English has been invaluable during his time here.

Palestine and Israel

CCIVS General Conference November 2023 Loutraki Greece: URGENT resolution on GAZA and PALESTINE

This article arrived too late for our December newsletter

Conference were deeply moved by reports from the Palestinian delegation of the suffering and devastation to which the population of Gaza is currently being subjected involving indiscriminate bombing and shelling of the civilian population resulting in great loss of life and injury to thousands of children and other civilians; the destruction of the service infrastructure leading to loss of power and water; a siege under which food, medical supplies and other relief is denied access to starving humanity.

In addition we were informed of the breakdown of civil order in the Occupied Palestinian Territory resulting in the killing of many Palestinians and the destruction of their property.

A motion was presented to conference that was discussed and passed overwhelmingly. Here it is together with an invitation from CCIVS to read, agree and sign. Endorsement can be given both by individuals and on behalf of organisations.

What is CCIVS?



CCIVS – the Coordinating Committee for International Voluntary Service was created in 1948 under the aegis of UNESCO. It is a global network of 188 international, regional and national organisations which actively engage in grass roots, community based projects. Volunteer Action for Peace is a member of CCIVS. Service Civil International, of which IVS is the British Branch, is also a member of CCIVS. For this reason, IVS is given associate status with CCIVS. Both VAP and IVS can participate in the actions of CCIVS

- CCIVS aims to pursue peace, global solidarity, and social justice. It seeks to respond to the prevalent issues of society at both local and global levels.
- CCIVS coordinates the Living Earth Campaign which focuses on what it means to live a
 peaceful and harmonious existence on Earth and respect towards the Earth as a living being.
- CCIVS has associate status with UNESCO and since 1987 has been recognised as a UN Messengers of Peace. The home page of CCIVS is https://ccivs.org



SCI Exchange Platform Meeting 2023

Some of the sessions had a more technical focus (eg. General Statistics of SCI, the Evaluation of SCI's Network Fee and of the Incoming Volunteers Fee, the Structure and Features of the new Online Placement System); others focused mainly on networking (eg. CCIVS/SCI/ICYE Decolonise IVS project, Creation of the Regional Network of the American IVS organisations, SCI's Grassroots project in Africa) and others aimed mostly at improving SCI's work and structures (LTVs Online Pre-Departure Training, SCI's Climate Team, No War Anywhere! Antimilitarism work in SCI and the Strengthening of SCI's international Working Groups).

IVS also actively participated in the annual meeting of the Africa Working Group through the presence of the two IVS members of the Steering Group, Kerry Hargadon and Nuno Doria. The very successful meeting took place on Saturday 14 October in two different sessions and was attended by 18 representatives of 3 SCI Branches and 10 African contacts, groups and partner organisations.
