# Merger of IVS and VAP

Following the agreement of IVS to merge made at the IVS AGM in June, the VAP Special General Meeting on 3 October agreed to authorise the closure of Volunteer Action for Peace which will become a department of International Voluntary Service GB. This was confirmed at a subsequent meeting.

The Charity Commission has been consulted on the proposed merger and a response is awaited.

## **Membership Subscriptions**

As part of the merger of IVS and VAP, members of VAP are encouraged to pay their membership fees into an on-going IVS bank account. Annual Membership fees for the merged organisation are £30 standard rate and £15 for persons who are students, unwaged or on a low income. Membership is valid for 12 months from the date of payment.

#### **International Volunteer statistics 2024**

VAP collaborates with the Alliance Network of like minded organisations in other countries to receive and send volunteers on projects of community value.

International Voluntary Service is a member of Service Civil International and collaborates with a largely different set of like minded organisations in other countries. The organisations SEEDS, in Iceland, is one of a few organisations abroad whose projects are on both the VAP and IVS lists.

International volunteering is slowly recovering from the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic when in 2020 and 2021 there were severe restrictions on international travel. The VAP Geneal Meeting in September 2024 was provided with volunteer statistics for the 2023-24 period:

- There were 8 'outgoing' short term volunteers through VAP with destinations of Iceland, Germany, and 2 in GB itself.
- There were 25 'Incoming' short and medium term volunteers through VAP attending projects in Britain. 19 of these volunteers were resident in European countries, 4 came from Asian countries (South Korea and Vietnam) and 2 from the Americas (Mexico)
- There were 3 incoming long term volunteers who came from France under their Service Civique programme. They were based at the Othona Community project in Bradwell-on-Sea, Essex.
- The 3 Long Term Volunteers and a few of the short term volunteers needed
   Certificates of Sponsorship from IVS in order to obtain visas to enter UK to attend
   VAP projects.
- IVS sent out 17 short term volunteers and received 22 short term volunteers in 2024.
- IVS sent 2 long term volunteers to a project in Cambodia. IVS provided 16 Certificates
  of Sponsorship for volunteers coming to IVS (largely longer term) projects in Britain.
  A number of other volunteers from the SCI network obtained Certificates of
  Sponsorship directly through the IVS project host.

Going forward, the merged organisation will continue to offer volunteering opportunities through the Alliance Network with which VAP has been involved and also through the SCI Network with which IVS is involved. Of note, since SCI improved its LTV database there have been more applications to be placed with IVS's project hosts.

#### **SCI International Committee Meeting – ICM**

The 88<sup>th</sup> ICM of SCI will be held at Penang, Malaysia organised by SCI-Malaysia from 5th-8th of December 2024.

Mohammad Rashid-Trustee and Board Member of IVS-Great Britain will be the official delegate of IVS-GB at this ICM . About 58 delegates and observers (in person and on line) will be participating in this ICM.

Main theme of this year's ICM will be to consolidate the work SCI already doing in the changing world of 21st century.

There will be number of resolutions to be debated, voted on and implemented including:

- 1. Strengthening SCI Regional Working Group.
- 2. Role of SCI in ICAN (stop nuclear weapons) and NMW (Anti-militarism).
- 3. Lost International Delegates (better prepared and informed delegates in ICM/EPM)
- 4. Financing SCI activities in changing funding Environment (Financial Spring Cleaning).
- 5. Governance of SCI including several changes in part of SCI Constitution.
- 6. SCI Solidarity Funds
- 7. Peace Activism Project Campaign
- 8. Declining volunteer numbers including expertise from former/returned volunteers and supporters.
- 9. Impact assessment of volunteering
- 10. Role of Socia Media and warmongering
- 11. Solidarity within the SCI movement
- 12. Situation in Israel and Palestine and standing of SCI

# SCI's Exchange Platform Meeting (EPM) 2024

This October, SCI branches, partners, and contacts had the opportunity to meet in person in Vienna for the annual Exchange Platform Meeting. IVS was represented by our Programme Manager Nuno Doria.

This year's meeting was graciously hosted by SCI Austria who did a terrific job even if with a very small team of activists. The theme this year was "Youth, Volunteering, and Resilience: Fostering Peace through Community Engagement," with most sessions focusing on these topics. 36 participants from 22 countries spent a week together, exchanging ideas, discussing, preparing proposals, and voting. There was also time to explore the city, celebrate birthdays, and enjoy a wide variety of potato dishes at the canteen!

The week officially opened on Tuesday with sessions on youth participation, during which we explored how to better engage younger generations by understanding their needs, challenges, and motivations, as well as a session on the impact assessment results and recommendations. That day, we had the opportunity to split into groups, go outside, and discuss how we confront challenges in our organizations.

On the second day, we addressed various topics, including better practices for international volunteering exchanges and ways to improve collaboration for our projects. We also had an inspiring session by the Climate team on the connection between Peace and Climate.

On day three, we engaged in a critical discussion on the decolonization of international volunteering and had the privilege of meeting Corinna from WeltWegWeiser to discuss quality standards for sending and hosting organizations.

Day four was particularly active; we began the day by discussing all aspects of SCI's working groups, including their past, present, and future.

IVS was represented by our Board member Kerry Hargadon at the Africa Working Group meeting and Nuno chaired the Abya Yala Working Group meeting which has now officially submitted a request for recognition as an official working group of SCI in the coming ICM in Malaysia.

We also received presentations on the pool of expertise initiative, the FLOW project, the Climate team and Climate manifesto, and we had the opportunity to prepare proposals for changes in our movement.

The final day started with an insightful workshop facilitated by SCI Switzerland on Peace Activism and Pacifism, followed by discussions and a vote on participants' proposals that will bring about change in our movement!



It was wonderful to see such a diverse group of people coming together for this exchange. Familiar faces mingled with many newcomers to EPM, all excited to share their experiences, build connections and inspire change!
